School Safety

T wo school shootings, Columbine and Parkland, drastically changed the the way Floridians view school security. Since that tragic day, many changes have been made in best practices, procedures, and laws in Florida. SJCA's faculty and staff take the safety of their scholars very seriously. Each year, improvements have been made to our campus to improve both safety and security. Our Safety Team consists of staff members representing teachers, nurses, student services personnel, security, and administration. They have spent many hours training in a variety of areas such as: Threat Assessment & Management, First Aid/CPR/AED, and Stop the Bleed. Our school guardian attends firearms and active shooter trainings throughout the year. Parents and students also play a vital role in school safety by adhering to the procedures in the handbook, following traffic pattern guidelines, and participating in "See Something, Say Something". The state of Florida utilizes an anonymous reporting tool called FortifyFL. This app is used by students, parents, and staff to report threatening comments and behaviors. The report is immediately sent to Clay County Sheriff's Office, School PD, and SJCA Administration. As a note of caution, be mindful using this app. False reporting will result in being charged with a felony. We appreciate your cooperation. Important Information from Mr. Griffin, SJCA's Academic Advisor

Due to COVID last Spring, all EOC's were cancelled and waived for the remaining school year. However, Algebra 1 EOC is still a requirement to graduate. We want to give scholars an opportunity to take the Geometry EOC and Biology EOC from last year, if they like to make it up. We have scheduled three days in November for these make-up tests. Biology EOC is a one-day test, while Algebra 1 and Geometry EOC's are two-day tests.

On Wednesday, October 14, 2020, all 8th and 9th graders with be taking the PSAT 8/9, while all sophomores and juniors will take the PSAT/NMSQT® on campus. These tests measure your scholar's knowledge and skills in reading, writing and math. The questions on the PSAT 8/9 are grade-appropriate for eighth and ninth graders, and the scores <u>ARE NOT</u> sent to colleges.

Taking the **PSAT/NMSQT** can encourage a student to start thinking seriously about life after high school, namely about college and career goals, and the education needed to reach those goals. The PSAT/NMSQT has been redesigned to mirror the redesigned SAT®.

Taking the PSAT/NMSQT provides the following advantages to students:

- It measures the reading, math, and writing skills needed for college (and for success in most jobs and careers in today's world). After the test, a score report will tell students how their skills measure up. Students can use it to find their "skill gaps" and then make plans to fill these gaps before college begins.
- Prepares students for the newly redesigned SAT.
- The Student Search Service® gives PSAT/NMSQT test takers the option to voluntarily place their names and addresses in a pool of college-bound students interested in receiving admission and

financial aid information from certified colleges, universities and scholarship agencies. (This information and opportunity will be sent out via MINT and on test day)

- Provides practice recommendations on Kahn Academy. PSAT/NMSQT gives a code to use on Kahn Academy for free test preparation and support on the SAT.
- Juniors who score well may qualify for National Merit Recognition and Scholarships.

SJCA Upper School House System



The House System is a traditional feature of many European schools in which the school is divided into subunits called "Houses." Upon entering Upper School, each student is assigned to a house, thus providing a focus for group loyalty and camaraderie. Our House System will split the Upper School

(grades 7-12) into four Houses. Each House will contain an equal number of young men and women from all Upper School grades.

Each year, as part of their graduation process, all students exiting 6th grade will go through a pinning ceremony where their House will be revealed, and they will be presented with a pin to wear each day at school. This year's house pinning ceremony will be held on October 21, 2020.

The purpose of the Houses is to provide a wide array of opportunities for student involvement and participation, as well as for a widely dispersed student government (with leadership and ambassadorship opportunities for those who seek them out). Within their Houses, students will plan and execute school events, foster mentoring relationships between various grades, and develop unique traditions.

Houses will compete for points throughout the year. Students will earn points for academic achievements and character/virtue awards. \hat{A} At the end of the year, the House with the most points will reign victorious with their emblem and colors proudly displayed in the cafeteria.

When students graduate, they will have had several years of planning and executive experience. If and when they choose to attend college, they will have the practical knowledge of how to begin clubs and associations, which is one of the core features of strong citizenship. The House System, then, is an education in civics because of the habits it encourages and forms.

What is CREW?

CREW at SJCA begins Wednesday, September 9th, for Upper School scholars.

CREW is a faith-based extra-curricular activity offered at SJCA for 7th grade and up. It begins right after dismissal in rooms 211 and 206 and ends at approximately 1:15.

CREW is an extra-curricular-

sponsored club that engages young women and men to encourage them to be leaders in their school and community by representing high moral and ethical values.

At CREW your scholar will share and learn in a fun, relaxed environment how to practically apply key core values in their lives, such as:

Community – Establishing community among the student body.




